DOMAIN PRIVACY

The protocols and policy surrounding WHOIS have not changed much since its conception in the ARPANET days, but its use has changed dramatically. The resource is increasingly used for originally unintended purposes, including law enforcement, domain solicitation and data mining, causing some to register their domains through privacy/proxy registration services.

The use of these services has become a center of debate. Some stakeholders would like to see restrictions placed on the use of privacy/proxy registrations, while others defend the importance of privacy for registrants.

IANA TRANSITION

Since the NTIA announced on March 14, 2014 that it intended to transition stewardship of the IANA functions to the global stakeholder community, ICANN has focused on developing a proposal that meets the requirements set forth by the NTIA. A successful proposal will have broad community support and sufficiently address four key principles:

- Support and enhance the Multistakeholder Model
- Maintain the security, stability, and resiliency of the Internet DNS
- Meet the needs and expectation of the global customers and partners of the IANA services
- Maintain the openness of the Internet

The transition was originally set to take place on 30 September 2015, but the NTIA extended the contract to expire 30 September 2016, giving ICANN more time to prepare for the transition.

ACCOUNTABILITY

Since it was created, ICANN has been held accountable by the US government's control of the IANA functions. Ensuring this accountability during and after the IANA transition is extremely important.

Concerns raised by the community have indicated that the accountability measures currently in place do not meet the expectations of stakeholders. Since "broad community support" is a requirement set forth by the NTIA, a disagreement on accountability could be a sticking point that will delay the transition.

Recently, the community proposed a "Sole Member model" as a way to ensure ICANN is held accountable to its stakeholders, but this proposal was met with resistance by the ICANN board.

NEW GTLD PROGRAM

ICANN's New gTLD Program was introduced in 2012 as a way to open up competition in the domain name markets. Now that the first round of gTLDs has concluded, domainers and industry professionals have their eye on the future of these extensions. Will these new top level domains edge into the mainstream, what are their best uses, and how will they succeed after so many years of .com? Equally important are the reviews of the New gTLD Program, focusing on topics such as rights protection, program implementation, security and stability, and consumer trust and choice.

BE A BUILDER

Strive for quality content, but don't sweat the small stuff. Corrections can always be made. Wikis are changeable and adaptive. Take a breath and get started.

BE REAL

Professionalism, trust, and community emerge when real people are involved, standing behind their work. Using your real name substantiates your commitment to "transparency" and allows others to better collaborate with you. Using your real name also generates a greater investment in your work.

Preparing to Edit



NEUTRAL POINT OF VIEW (NPOV)

Neutral Point of View (NPOV) is the way in which articles on this site and all wiki sites should be written. That is, wiki articles should not contain bias or unverifiable facts and opinions. This line can often be hard to draw. For example, on our site we often list the services of a given company, but we try to remove any marketing spin or unverifiable language that implies these services accomplish something that their competitors do not. Generally speaking, when opinions are stated as facts, or when unappealing facts are intentionally omitted, then the article is not written from a NPOV.

At ICANNWiki, we insist on including references, and generally omit article sections that can not be backed up by at least one verifiable reference. We are constantly editing our articles to better adhere to our Values and improve their status as neutral articles.



SOURCES


When adding or editing content on ICANNWiki, it is important that you substantiate verifiable information with corresponding references. Third-party sources such as multi-stakeholder monitored governance bodies (ISOC, ICANN, IANA) or any other source known for its careful contributions to the subject of Internet governance (CircleID, DN Journal) are helpful, resourceful complements to your work.



ORIGINAL RESEARCH

ICW's dynamic and rigorous nature can be attributed to the site's emphasis on original research. Copying and pasting from another encyclopedia or other resources does a disservice to you and your reader's education. While it is okay to reformulate an idea's concept for your own understanding, it is not okay to closely paraphrase or plagiarize. In the end, go for simplicity and don't worry about over-explaining a concept.

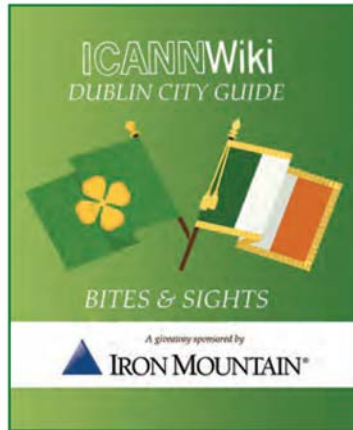

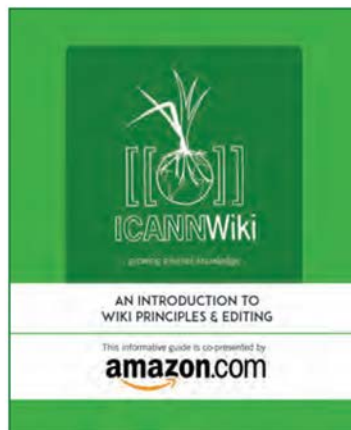
CARICATURE BADGES

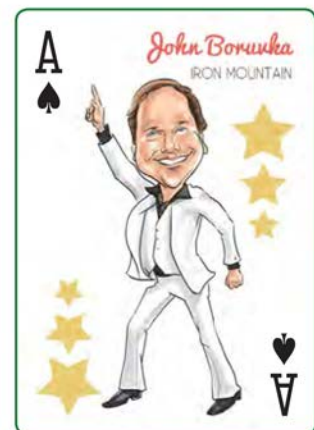
EDIT-A-THON
